

Dear Parents and Families,

Firstly, welcome back after the Easter break - we hope you were able to enjoy some good weather and that you and your children have had the opportunity to rest and to spend time together. As usual we have a busy term ahead of us and we are very much looking forward to all that has been planned.

#### Staffing Updates

At the end of this half term, we will say farewell to Mrs Andrews as she begins her retirement. We are so very grateful for the skills, wisdom, insights and expertise that she has so willingly and calmly shared across the whole school over the last five years. We know she will be missed enormously by staff and children alike, but are delighted that she has agreed to be available for occasional class cover teaching if required.

#### Community Involvement

It was a real pleasure to see how enthusiastic Owl class were for their cake sale last term which was linked to their Jigsaw and PSHE learning. The sale was in aid of Chestnut Tree House, one of our chosen charities. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to raise £134. We are also very grateful for your kind donations on World Book Day of food items, and we aim to deliver these to The Wholesome Warehouse in the very near future.

We have received several emails thanking us for the Easter cards which the children designed and signed for residents of local care homes. If you were unaware, each Christmas and Easter, our children design a card in school for a competition. The winning cards are then printed, signed by the children and delivered to local care homes. It is only a small thing for us to do, but it brings great joy to those who receive them, especially when they may not have very many visitors. We are looking to extend our delivery service next year to include, among others, The Wholesome Warehouse. #### Absence from School

At Ashurst, we firmly believe that regular school attendance is vital for children to thrive both educationally and personally. The benefits are unmistakable - being in school helps our children learn how to make friendships, to practise kindness, to become confident, to work together happily, and to feel proud of their school.

For reasons such as these, and to support every child's success, the Department for Education requires all schools to monitor attendance closely and to contact parents/carers when a child's attendance falls below the threshold of 90%. For all the reasons above, our school's expectation is at least 95%. We completely understand that some absences, like illness or bereavement, are unavoidable and these are recorded appropriately. However, when attendance drops too low, children can miss valuable learning which may affect their progress.

Being on time to school is also important, as late arrivals can add up and affect attendance. Our school day starts at 9:00 am, and arriving on time helps children settle in, enjoy a smooth start, and make the most of their learning. It also ensures the class is not disrupted, creating a positive experience for everyone.

May I also take this opportunity to say that we would much prefer it if families gave a genuine reason for absence, rather than notifying us that children are unwell when they may not be. As you may expect, your children are the first to tell us that they were on a plane or on holiday when we were still in school. This does not apply to many families, but several children have been very upfront about their holiday details over the last term! We do thank you for ensuring that your recent requests for absence from school, including late arrivals and early departures due to medical/dental appointments have been accompanied by an absence request form (these are available to download from our website or paper copies are available from the school office).

#### After school Clubs

Once again, I would like to thank you for signing up to, and supporting your children to attend our afterschool clubs. We are able to offer a wide range of activities and this is down to the commitment, goodwill and generosity of the parents and staff who support us. We do not charge for afterschool clubs and to ensure the smooth running of these activities we do appreciate it if, once signed up, your child/ren do continue to attend. After school clubs do not run in the first or last week of each full term but continue to run to the end of each half term and the start of each half term (see dates below).

#### Parents' Consultations and reports

This term parents' consultations are for those children completing EYFS and Y6. These will take place for EYFS (YR) on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> July and for Y6 on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> July 2025. In working towards being a paperless office, this year we will be sending children's annual reports home via email. If you would prefer a paper copy, please do contact the office and we will arrange this for you.

### Y6 Leaver's Service at Christs' Hospital

This year our Y6 Diocesan Leaver's Service will be at Christ's Hospital on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> June at 10.45. Y6 parents are warmly invited to attend and to join us for lunch afterwards, hopefully, at 'Stooks Restaurant', Newbridge Garden Centre, Billingshurst Rd, Broadbridge Heath, Horsham RH12 3LN.

If you are unable to attend the service, please bring your child into school as normal and we will arrange transport to the service and lunch in staff cars. Similarly, if you are only able to attend the service, we will arrange to transport them to their lunch. Menus and more information will be available shortly.

#### Uniform requirements for Academic Year 2024-2025

We ask that all children wear the Ashurst school uniform every day. The requirements have remained the same and have not changed for over 7 years. We are very proud of our school and ask for your support in maintaining the correct uniform.

If your child has a particular need which necessitates an adaptation or change to the school uniform listed below, please make an appointment to discuss this with Mrs Smith.

Please ensure that all items are named we spend a lot of time trying to identify the owners of sweatshirts and hoodies, particularly those that have been acquired through our preloved school uniform stockist, Mrs Green.

Whilst the children can sometimes identify their items by smelling them, staff do not share this skill! Lost property items are kept in a box in the library.

Grey skirt, culottes or pinafore dress

Grey tailored trousers (long or short)

Green sweatshirt with school badge or green sweater/ cardigan (not their PE hoody).

White shirt/ blouse/polo shirt

White, black or grey socks

White, grey or green tights

Sensible shoes or sandals

Green and white checked dress/checked 'playsuit'

Wellies for the field when it is muddy. These, like all other uniform, should be named.

#### PE Kit:

<mark>Green</mark> or white shorts/skorts, white T-shirt with a round neck, white socks, trainers, green hoody and green joggers.

Trainers are the preferred footwear as they are more substantial than black plimsoles. Leggings, joggers and shorts/skorts in other colours are not permitted unless this has been previously discussed and agreed with Mrs Smith. We continue to ask that PE kits be worn to school on days that your child has PE or is attending the after-school sports club

Sports Club is on Thursday.

PE: Mouse Class - Thursday & Friday, Squirrel Class - Thursday & Friday, Owl Class - Tuesday

#### Jewellery/ hair wear

Jewellery should not be worn by children with the exception of stud earrings which should be removed or covered with tape for PE.

Hairbands/scrunchies are to be green, white, grey, black, navy or brown. Children's hair should be completely tied up once it is long enough to do so and this applies to both boys and girls.

May we also ask that children have a coat, a water bottle and school book bag (order via the school uniform link on the website) in school every day. These fit in the children's drawers and help letters, homework and reading books make the journey home safely!
