Funding allocation

"Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport

you offer." (DfE May 2019)

The government is providing additional funding for the academic year 2020/21 to improve provision of physical education and sporting opportunities in primary schools. This funding has been provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

Sports Premium Objectives.

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

The 5 main objectives which need to be fulfilled are as follows:

- 1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity- the Chief Medical Officer's guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Context of the school and rationale for the strategy

Ashurst Church of England Aided Primary School is a small rural village school. We have 3 vertically grouped classes with 52 fulltime children, of whom less than 15% are in receipt of pupil premium funding. The number of pupils for whom English is not their first language is less than 15%. We strive to ensure that the individual needs of our pupils are met, including those of our disadvantaged and most vulnerable children. 100% of children said they were active every day or all the time.' (Autumn 2022).

Areas for Development

- To increase our involvement in inter house and school competitions.
- To increase the choice of activities of available to children during break times including providing new playground markings and equipment.
- To increase involvement of children in out of school sporting activities.
- To develop our outside learning environment to increase children's opportunities to learn outside of the classroom
